Shiprock North Campus Garden: Care and maintenance of the North campus garden, involving cultivating, maintenance, tilling, site preparation, irrigation, harvesting, and related activities.

Dine College – DECO (Dine Ecology) Club: A student oriented club, interns will be involved in planning, development and initiation of various environmental activities within Dine College campuses and local community projects. These include DEI Symposium, DECO club, gardening, recycling, community events, etc.

IT Internships: Involves assisting Information Technology (IT) personnel in their daily work. Must be a self-starter and eager to learn about computer hardware and software maintenance. (Preferred major: Math, CIS or CS with a strong interest in working in this area, GPA 3.0.) Supervisor: Tonya Clark (SR), Courtney Gorman (TS).

Region IX Water Quality Sampling project: project activities will involve water sampling, soil sampling (Tsaiile area), assist in data analysis, field verifications and other activities.

CO₂ Monitoring and the Impact of Forests: Roof Butte and Computer Monitoring Requires working with instrumentation, some maintenance and working with data sets with computers. PI – Beth Holland, University of Colorado..

Tutoring and mentoring: Peer education and mentoring in Math, English, Reading and Navajo language and Navajo History/Culture. Peer educators have to retain a 3.5 GPA or better in their areas of disciplines and able to provide mentoring and support to students. Hourly (\$10.00/hr.)
