



Summer Research Enhancement Program of Diné College June 3 – August 10, 2012

A 10-week program designed to prepare Native American freshman and sophomore college students for careers in cancer and diabetes prevention. The program has three stages:

- Stage 1 Intensive 3-week training in Public Health Research Methods at Diné College Tsaile campus
- Stage 2 Six-week mentored internship in student's home community
- Stage 3 One week analysis and presentation at Diné College

While participating in SREP, the students receive the following:

- \$3,200 stipend (distributed in installments)
- 7 transferrable college credit hours in Public Health (4 classroom and 3 practicum)
- Tuition, books and materials for the Public Health courses required for SREP
- Room and board while at the Diné College Tsaile campus
