

The Barbara and Robert Swan Scholarship

This scholarship has been set up to provide non-traditional college students, at Diné College, financial support for the everyday expenses of attending college. Everyday expenses are considered to be such things as transportation to and from campus, technology, and fees associated with being a college student. The scholarship is intended for Non-Traditional students and there will be 10 recipients selected from Dine College.

Deadline is February 02, 2018 for SPRING 2018 semester

Information Students Should Know Before Applying for Scholarship

1. Students, whether female or male, must be of Native American background.
2. Preference will be given to non-traditional students (i.e., returning to school or beginning school at an older age than the usual college population).
3. Preference will be given to students who take a full-time load. However, if there is money available after the granting of full-time scholarships (as defined in #6 and #7 below), partial-load scholarships can be awarded, such as half the money for a 6 credit semester load.
4. To apply, students must have one semester of college work to judge the potential of future work.
5. The total scholarship award for the academic year will be equally divided and awarded to students at the beginning of each semester they qualify (as defined in #6 and #7 below).
6. To continue the scholarship, students must have a cumulative grade point average of C or above and make satisfactory academic progress toward the completion of a degree as established by Diné College.
7. To continue the full scholarship, students must take a 12 credit load each semester, or can meet the requirement with a 9 credit load each semester and a 6 credit load in the summer session.

Applying for Scholarship

1. Contact Financial Aid Officer at Diné College's Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships on the Tsaile Campus.
2. Complete Diné College Student Profile and Application for Barbara and Robert Swan Scholarship.
3. Submit copy of most recent transcript for at least one semester of college work.
