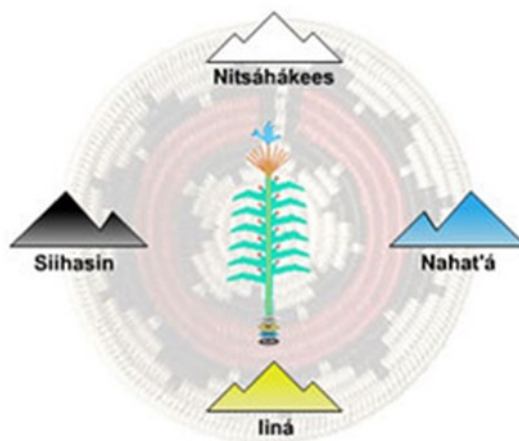

Disability Support Services (DSS)

The DSS program work hard to ensure students with disabilities have access to a quality post-secondary educational learning by providing reasonable accommodations as needed.

Examples of reasonable accommodations:

- Ensure existing facilities are readily accessible
- Adaptive equipment & materials
- Note taking, recording of lectures
- Extended times w/ homework & special projects
- Out-of-classroom testing, i.e. extended time w/ quizzes & exams

Eligibility for DSS:

A student requesting accommodation(s) must provide documentation of a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits his or her ability to perform one or more major life activities compared to most people:

- Learning Disabilities
- Hearing/Visual Impairments
- Mobility/physical Challenges
- Psychological Impairments

Note:

- Documentation must be within the last three-years.
- Must update case each semester: Fall, Spring, & Summer when requesting services.
