

The New Mexico Water Resources Research Institute's 67<sup>th</sup> Annual New Mexico Water Conference entitled, *Our Interconnected Communities—and Interconnected Waters*, will take place in a hybrid format with in-person activities taking place at the Las Cruces Convention Center, adjacent to New Mexico State University, and online via Zoom on October 26-27, 2022. A highlight of each year's annual water conference is a poster session where participants can learn about current water research taking place around the state and region.

We are looking to spread the word for our Call for Poster Abstracts, which is open to any New Mexico water research or management topic. Students, researchers, practitioners, and faculty (including agency and laboratory personnel) are all encouraged to submit an abstract.

This year's poster session will be held in-person on October 27, 2022, in a 75-minute session. Accepted poster presenters will be required to have someone stand next to their research poster to allow for questions and feedback. This improves visibility of the project and strengthens collaboration opportunities. Each poster has a size requirement of 3 ft x 4 ft to accommodate the backing board.

This year's poster session offers a wonderful opportunity for networking with state and regional water experts. We anticipate about 250 attendees at this year's conference.
