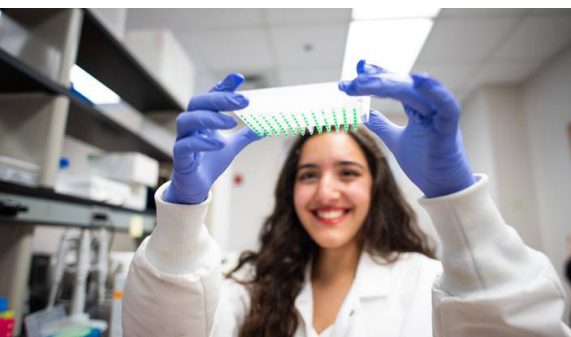

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants from R-2 and below schools, rural communities, and underrepresented groups are especially encouraged to apply (e.g., racial and ethnic minorities, students with disabilities, individuals from low-income households, first-generation college students, and those with limited research opportunities at home institutions) are especially encouraged to apply.

- All are welcome to apply, however, preference will be given to:

U.S. Citizens, U.S. Permanent Residents or DACA

First and second year undergraduates enrolled full-time in accredited four-year colleges or universities in the U.S. at time of application

- Expected GPA of 3.0 or above (please note: no minimum GPA is required; exceptional circumstances will be considered)
- Interested in pursuing a physician-scientist career (Dual M.D./Ph.D. training)
- Willing to make a dedicated effort and commit full-time (40 hours per week) to the program. Participants are not allowed vacation time outside of WUSM-defined holidays for the duration of the program
- Significant research experience is not required
