FUTURE FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

NATIVE AMERICAN LANGUAGE PRESERVATION AND MAINTENANCE -ESTHER MARTINEZ IMMERSION

Full Proposal due: April 21, 2023

Funding Amount: Award Ceiling \$300,000 per month & Award Floor \$100,000

EMI Program is to provide financial assistance to community-driven projects designed to preserve Native American languages through Native American language nests and Native American language survival schools. ANA is interested in supporting locally determined projects designed to enhance or improve community conditions and achieve long-range community goals. The EMI program focuses on support for projects that are based on teaching and building capacity for language immersion instruction. Funded EMI projects reflect measurable outcomes and include specific strategies for achieving intended objectives. To perpetuate the language preservation efforts for Native communities, if appropriate, EMI projects should identify opportunities for the replication or modification of such projects for use by other Native Americans, and include a plan for the preservation of the products of the Native American language project for the benefit of future generations of Native Americans and other interested persons.

OFFICE OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION (OPE): HIGHER EDUCATION PROGRAMS (HEP): STRENGTHENING INSTITUTIONS PROGRAMS (SIP), ASSISTANCE LISTING NUMBER 84.031A

Full Proposal due: May 22, 2023

Funding Amount: Award Ceiling \$550,000 per month & Award Floor \$N/A

The SIP Program provides grants to eligible institutions of higher education (IHEs) to help them become self-sufficient and expand their capacity to serve low-income students by providing funds to improve and strengthen the institution's academic quality, institutional management, and fiscal stability. RURAL HEALTH CARE COORDINATION PROGRAM DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES HEALTH RESOURCES AND SERVICES ADMINISTRATION

Full Proposal due: May 15, 2023

Funding Amount: Award Ceiling \$300,000 per month & Award Floor \$N/A

This award is intended to serve as initial seed funding to implement creative community-based health solutions in rural communities to expand access to and coordination of care with the expectation that awardees will then be able to sustain the program after the federal funding ends. Full Proposal due: April 20, 2023

Funding Amount: Award Ceiling \$300,000 per month & Award Floor \$N/A

The primary goal of F2F is to generate sustainable, broad-based economic growth in the agricultural sector. A secondary goal is to increase the American public's understanding of international development issues and programs and international understanding of the U.S. and U.S. development programs. F2F objectives are to: 1) increase agricultural sector productivity and profitability; 2) improve conservation and sustainable use of environmental and natural resources; 3) expand sector access to financial services; and 4) strengthen agricultural sector institutions. F2F activities are varied and conform to local country needs and strategic objectives. Activities are inclusive and fully demand-driven, responding to requests and needs of local hosts. F2F country project areas align with or support USAID Mission Strategies and objectives or those of other USG programs. [Full Details](#)
