

Office of Assessment and Accreditation Annual Assessment Report 2021

- 1. <u>Introduction/Context & Highlights:</u> The Office of Assessment and Accreditation in conjunction with the Academic Siih Hasin Committee (ASHC) conducted the Annual Assessment days on, Monday and Tuesday, May 17-18, 2021. The two-day event included the Degree Program Assessment Review (DPAR) for the following 7 programs: AA. Diné Studies; AA. Social Work; AA. Social and Behavioral Science; Cert. Navajo Nation Leadership; AA. Business Administration; AS. Health Occupation; BS. Public Health; and BS. Secondary Education (Math & Science).
- 2. <u>DPARs:</u> includes a Submission, Assessment Analysis and Comprehensive Report. Based on the submission for May the following are outstanding and made it complicated to further the process. It should be pointed out that the ASHC needs the support of the Provost, and the Deans, to encourage the faculty to stay up to date with the DPAR1 Reports and to be more serious about assessment. These supervisors are the only ones that can provide realistic oversight and encouragement to do assessment properly. It should also be mentioned that the Deans or Department Chair in the School should be more involved with the academic details of each program so that more detailed oversight and direction can be supplied by the Provost and Deans or Department Chair.
